## National Night Out 2010

National Night Out is a community-police awareness-raising event that will be held on August 3rd this year. It is designed to heighten crime and drug prevention awareness; generate support for and participation in local crime prevention agencies and programs; strengthen neighborhood spirit and community-police relationships, and; send a message to criminals that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. The City of Murfreesboro will be hosting 7 sites this year. Each location will start at 5pm and end around 8pm. Everything provided at these events will be at no charge and admission is free to the public. All sites will have a food court serving hot dogs and cold water available on a first come first served basis, fingerprint and DNA kits, and local agencies and businesses providing crime prevention information.

### Yard Inspections

Every Tuesday the Maintenance Department will inspect each and every yard. If the following violations are noted they will be corrected by our staff and you will be charged accordingly:

- Picking up trash in the yard—\$20
- Removing indoor furniture from porch/yard, swing sets, swimming pools, etc.—\$20
- Mowing grass—\$20 (Oakland & Mercury Courts only)
- Returning trash cans to station—\$10  
(Franklin & Highland Hts. only)

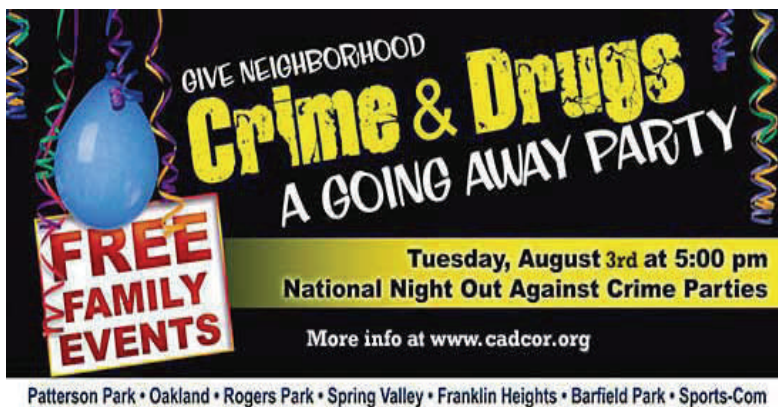
### Maintenance Calls—After Hours Emergencies

The number to call for after hours emergencies is 542-0050. Keep in mind that if maintenance is called to your apartment after hours and it is not an emergency you will be charged for the visit.

Emergencies consist of:

- Investigate gas leaks;
- Light heater pilots when temp is below 50 degrees;
- Water leaks that create a safety hazard;
- Stopped commode in units with only one bathroom;
- Any other situation that may pose a danger to tenants or excessive property damage if ignored.

### NNO Site Breakdown of Events

National Night Out has 3 convenient sites for residents of Public Housing.

Franklin Heights will have games for adults and children including bingo, reading tent, and a water slide, food (including hot dogs and fish from the Fish House on Bridge Ave.), Green House Ministries will be making homemade ice cream and providing door prizes, and a DJ will be on hand to provide music.
